


# Patient Preferences for Surgical Treatment of End-Stage Knee Osteoarthritis

Total knee arthroplasty (TKA) and unicompartmental knee arthroplasty (UKA) are commonly used treatments for knee osteoarthritis



Patient preference and eligibility for either of these treatment options may impact the ideal treatment choice

Survey on selection of arthroplasty procedure

**Patient survey attributes**

- Chance of complications
- Functional ability
- Awareness of the knee implant
- Reoperation within 10 years




Fair/poor function
