

Side Effects:

- Pupil Constriction
- Urinary Retention
- Nausea + Vomiting
- Constipation
- Help, I'm Itchy
- Ew, I'm Sweating
- Depression of Respirations

Teaching:

Analgesics are great
They help with the pain
Dilaudid and morphine
are in the chain, but watch out
they can be addictive like cocaine
Don't wine and dine or your respiration
will decline and narcosis you will need
in your blood line!




GI/GU HEART
