Third Round Survey

The development of a Bayesian model to predict implementation success of physical activity interventions in youth-serving organizations

Recently, the expert panel achieved consensus on the definition of implementation success and identified 23 factors to be included in the model for predicting implementation success. The purpose of this round 2 survey is to develop the likelihood ratios for the identified factors, which consists of 2 major sections:

Section I (23 questions): Estimating likelihood ratios for each factor

Tasks: Looking at one factor at a time, provide subjective estimates of how likely a specific factor level will be observed in organizations assuming a successful implementation. Then, repeat the procedures assuming an unsuccessful case.

Section II (60 questions): Estimating holistic ratings for hypothetical profiles of youth-serving organizations

Tasks: Looking at all 23 factors at the same time, provide an overall estimate of how likely organizations with such a profile will have a successful implementation.




